## Most stylish loos on coast at Narooma Kinema

New art deco style toilets at the Narooma Kinema, officially opened last Wednesday, make the downstairs toilets at the cinema building the most stylish on the coast.

"Checking out the loos could become almost as big an attraction as the movie, and will be appreciated by everyone for many years to come," said School of Arts committee spokesman Laurelle Pacey.

The new loos were officially opened by committee member Mina Watt, who then led an inspection of the new loos.

Ms Pacey said management and maintenance of the School of Arts' assets, including the Memorial Hall, is the responsibility of the Narooma community through the School of Arts and its management committee. The committee leases the memorial Hall to John and Janette Griffiths, who operate the Narooma Kinema.

The new downstairs toilets and the installation of early smoke and fire detections system are the two latest stages in the committee's seven-stage project to enhance the 90-year-old Memorial Hall, which houses the Kinema.

"The toilet project has been a real team effort," she said. "Our design team of Stephanie Simko and Jenni Bourke has evoked the Art Deco and picture palace era. We've also incorporated light fittings that originally hung in the main auditorium but been in storage for many years.

"A huge thank you to Harvey Shears of H & A Builders and his team who took on the task to make our vision a reality. His team includes contractors Narooma Plumbing Services, Narooma Electrics and tiler Shannon Van Ort, who meticulously followed Steph and Jen's design.

"We also want to thank Swan Plumbing Supplies who have been so helpful and supportive, Eurobodalla Tiling, Homeflair Carpets and Blinds, Chris Young's Joinery and Narooma Glass."

This year the committee's grant writing team secured four government grants for different elements of the Memorial Hall project.

"These will enable the School of Arts to complete the Hall Project in 2017, with the work timed to minimise disruption to Kinema operations," Ms Pacey said.

"There is still a shortfall but with Kinema Kate's help making up that shortfall is not onerous."

Work previously completed as part of the Memorial Hall project was the re-sheeting and insulation of the roof and installation of solar panels.

The remaining work is construction of a wrap-around awning to the back of the disabled toilet providing more undercover area for patrons, improving facilities for live theatre, repair and repainting of the hall's exterior, and restoring the granite plaques on the front façade.
