Ay was a particularly exciting month for Narooma's Arts Precinct, what with preparations for the River of Art, staging of the Art Prize in the SoART Gallery and the Studios, and the Studios' two workshops, the burlesque-circus-style Kinema Kabaret and the Busking Festival. We also introduced Lady Baa Baa, mascot for the Fibre Festival in October.

All of this required much behind the scenes work from a team of many of our wonderful enthusiastic and creative community volunteers. It is amazing what can be achieved with everyone working together.

The School of Arts also sponsored the inaugural People's Choice Award at the River of Art Prize of \$200 which was won by Gillian

Wylde for her cockatoo painting .

The wonderful Rotary Narooma Busking Championships was on the last Saturday of the River of Art. The School of Arts sponsored a Hot Spot in front of the SoART Gallery as well as a performance prize in the competition; it was awarded by the judges to the Queanbeyan Pipes and Drums.

There is no doubt Narooma really supports the wonderful shire-wide River of Art Festival. Once the new Narooma Arts & Community Centre (NACC) is built it will provide an even better venue for Festival activities here.

Meanwhile some of the team is working with our architects ClarkeKeller on the proposed NACC and on amending the School of Arts' constitution to bring it in line with 2016 changes to the model rules and the repeal of the *Trustees of School of Arts Enabling Act* 1902. We are progressing!

NACC plans are progressing towards DA stage

Plans for Narooma Arts & Community Centre (NACC) are gaining momentum as the numerous and necessary consultants' reports are prepared ready for our Development Application to Eurobodalla Shire Council.

Some slight adjustments are still being made by our architects to ensure our plans meet both building and Council requirements and the community's needs.

Community response to date to this ambitious School of Arts' initiative has been really rewarding for the extensive team of artists and others who have put so much into it over the last 10 years. The plans will be on display in the SoART Gallery from mid July for your perusal and comment.



The front of the NACC was completely redesigned by our architects ClarkeKeller following feedback from the community. The NACC is the same height as the Memorial Hall (Kinema) at the front and predominately no higher going back on the block, and stepped back from it to respect the heritage status of the Hall. The Hall was built in 1925 as the town's multi-purpose community venue and the town's memorial to its soldiers who fought in the First World War.
