SoART Gallery hosts Art Prize

Our SoART Gallery will again host the River of Art festival Art Prize 18-27 September. Organisers invite entries from all South Coast artists. Applications close 18 August.

The Art Prize is a highlight of the festival, Eurobodalla's annual celebration of our region's rich artistic life. COVID restrictions mean this will be a 'slimmed down' festival but still with everyone's favourites such as the Art Prize, Open Studios, workshops and exhibitions.

This year's festival theme is 'Resilience and Renewal' to reflect the region's response to the bushfires and the pandemic, but there is no theme for the Art Prize.

The winning artist will receive \$2,000, the runner-up \$250, and the most highly recommended artist \$100. Finalists will be selected by a judging panel of three well-known professional artists.

All finalists will be exhibited in the SoART Gallery where the award ceremo-

ny will be held within Covid restrictions, date to be confirmed. Digital images of finalists' work will also be exhibited online. Given COVID restrictions on galleries, those whose work is not shortlisted will only be exhibited in an online Salon des Refusés on the River of Art website.

financial skills to steer us smoothly to the completion of the building project. We are currently coming up with a list of possible people who have been identified in the community as possibilities. A pre-requisite of course is that they share our passion for the SOA, our community and thenew building.

So, as you can see, there's lots happening behind the scenes, including keeping an eye open for relevant grants. We will also be getting a team together to pull that together: first we need about \$200,000 to get us to the Construction Certificate stage, then we need to get the funds to build it, an estimated \$4m.
