stage. Now to make it a reality. It will include:

- Three studio/workshops/meeting rooms (at the rear) – suitable for Arts workshops, meetings, educational classes, singing groups etc. Studio 1 will have a sprung floor for dance classes and rehearsals, as well as Life Drawing.
- gallery-exhibition area (highway frontage)
- a catering-level kitchen.

The site is owned by our community, not Council, and held and managed for the community by the SOA.

With the project now 'shovel ready', we will seek funding for the estimated \$4m build from several sources, including the Australian Government, the NSW Government, various Foundations, philanthropic companies and individuals, smaller family foundations and generous locals.
