he School of Arts' team responsible for progressing the Narooma Arts Community Centre (NACC) has not stopped grinning since hearing we would receive a \$7.27m grant from the Bushfire Lo-Economic Recovery (BLER) Fund on behalf of our community. The NACC will become a reality!

This grant will fund the full cost of the NACC's construction from detailed design, site works, construction and fit-out. The plan is for it to open in the second half of 2023.

Narooma School of Arts President Jenni Bourke said "everyone is absolutely thrilled" and congratulations have come from far and wide.

"The ongoing benefits of the NACC Project far outweigh the costs. It will be such a boost to local morale as will the other successful local BLERF projects. We have passed on our congratulations to them all."

The School of Arts Management committee and the NACC Project Subcommittee are keen to celebrate with all our members, but feel it prudent to wait until COVID-19 restrictions are eased. We will keep you posted.

"The NACC with its three multi-use studios/rooms and gallery will be the heart of our community for everyone to use, young and old, and it will enrich our wider community well into the future," Jenni said.

"Its uses are only limited by everyone's imagination. What's so fantastic is it's a community initiative to meet long term needs identified by our community and has been extensively thought through for more than 10 years.

"At this stage, it's really important to acknowledge the many people who have worked so hard towards this vision over the years, including our architect CK Architecture."

She said the NACC will:

- ⇒ enhance the School of Arts precinct which includes the Kinema, creating an inspiring cultural and community hub.
- ⇒ support the community's ongoing social recovery
  - ⇒ stimulate economic growth, particularly through job creation and cultural tourism
  - ⇒ strengthen the community's ability to cope with future disasters and challenges
  - ⇒ provide a backup evacuation centre during natural disasters.

Narooma School of Arts owns land and buildings valued at \$3m on behalf of the community, and manages and enhances them on the community's behalf for the Arts in its broadest sense. These buildings are the Kinema, Gallery and Studios.
