he School of Arts' wonderful special waterfall curtain in the Kinema was fixed last month (at great expense to the School of Arts!) after six months' of not working. The repairs were done by Jands who installed the curtain in 2017.

The problem appears to have been caused by an initial incident in 2019 which impeded the curtain's closure; its operation thereafter gradually got worse. As a result, strict conditions will now govern the curtain's future operation by other users including an induction process to try to prevent it ever happening again. The key is no obstruction to the curtain's clear opening and closing.
