# Print workshop hits the spot

An Introduction to Printmaking workshop was held in the School of Arts' Narooma Gallery on Saturday afternoon 19 November. It attracted eight people from as far afield as Bega, Lake Tabourie and Beechworth plus locals. One participant holidaying here said it's the ideal activity for someone seeking art classes while in town.

It was hosted by School of Arts Committee members Ann Espinoza and Barbara McConchie. Participants had the opportunity to create their own prints using existing materials such as ready cut lino blocks, dry points and numerous items that created textures when rolled up with ink and put through a printing press.

"The workshop was non stop," Barbara said. "Once the inks were rolled out participants didn't stop experimenting until the last minute of the event. Everyone went home with several prints and some with embossing."

The School of Arts' committee looks forward to hosting more short art workshops and events in the lead up to the new building.

## **NACC Project update**

The NACC Project is still programmed to commence construction on site after the summer holiday period.

Due to the extraordinary increases in construction costs in the last year, Narooma School of Arts (NSoA) has been invited to lodge a request for additional funding.

If successful, the anticipation is that NSoA would then enter into a Construction Contract early in the new year to enable completion of the project by mid 2024.

Most of the Project's cost will be met by the Bushfire Local Economic Recovery

Fund grant which is jointly funded by the Australian and NSW Governments.


