Drilling for the NACC Project

You may have noticed drilling on the site of the new Narooma Arts & Community Centre (NACC) over recent days. This is to gain geotechnical information about the soils on site which will inform the final engineering designs for the new building.

Since the last newsletter, our Project Manager NSW Public Works Advisory on behalf of Narooma School of Arts, called for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) from construction companies wishing to preregister to tender for the proposed building contract. EOIs closed 1 March. These are currently being assessed and shortlisted to invite to tender.

School of Arts President Jenni Bourke said the committee is so excited to be finally moving ahead with the project after so many years of planning.

"We're so proud that the NACC is a community initiative on community-owned land," she said.

"With three multi-use studios/rooms and a large gallery it will be at the heart of our community to meet long term community needs especially creative pursuits.

Our architect CK Architecture is now in the final throes of the detailed design work with a team of consultants.

The costs of the Project will be met by a \$7.27m grant from the Bushfire Local Economic Recovery Fund jointly funded by the NSW and Australian Governments. The NACC is due to open its doors in the second half of 2023.
