River of Art looks to 2023

The River of Art Prize was held at the Bay Pavilions instead of Narooma Gallery this year. Viewing the exhibition was a great opportunity to also check out the Pavilions.

Twenty-nine entries were displayed in the final from 53 entries by 41 artists from Canberra, Sydney and Melbourne as well as the South Coast. ROA chair Leanne Joyce described the entries as "very diverse" that "demonstrated again the quality and commitment of artists in our region, and its ability to inspire artists from further afield".

During the two-week Festival, three local photographers Corin Rossouw, Allison Aitken and Katherine Wagner held a stunning and different exhibition in Narooma Gallery 'Through the Lens of Locals'.

These were just two of the record 130 exhibitions, workshops, open studios and performances in and around Moruya, Narooma and Batemans Bay during the Festival last month, concluding with the biggest laser and light show ever seen in South East NSW - Luminous: Art After Dark'. Luminous

Wood chop raises funds

A blast from the past...

*Building Narooma's Memorial Hall (operating today as the Kinema) required a lot of fundraising by our community over several years. Balls, dances and school concerts were popular, as was the occasional wood chop. This report is from Moruya Examiner in 1922.

NAROOMA. (From our Correspondent.) The wood-chop ... was held on the 23rd instant, under the auspices of the Soldiers War Memorial Hall Committee. The £5 prize and the logs were generously donated by Mr. J. P. Hyland, of the Narooma Hotel. There was a fairly large attendance, and during the chopping contest there was keen excitement, which made a very enjoyable afternoon. A collection was taken up on the ground by the committee resulting in the sum of £3 being added to the Memorial Hall Fund. Following is the result of the chop: - Final. C. Backhouse, 13 secs – 1; T. Hawke, 26 - 2; R. McMillan, scratch - 3. Barling Bros. were unfortunate in having their axes damaged during the chop.
