Winners of the delayed 2021 River of Art Prize were announced at the exhibition's official opening at the School of Arts Narooma Gallery on 20 January. Exhibition of the final 22 works continues at the Gallery until 6 February. The 2021 River of Art prize had been rescheduled because of last year's COVID-19 lockdown.

The winner was Geoffrey Odgers for his work *Burnt Offerings* (see below). Victoria Collins's *Sapling Forest in Crimson* was runner up with Grace Paleg's *Kiss the Floor* highly commended.

River of Art Festival chair Leanne Joyce congratulated the win- At 2 ners. "It's a very diverse exhibition from a highly talented and committed field," she

said. "Fifty artists entered 63 works from within and beyond the Eurobodalla, demonstrating again the quality and commitment of artists in our region."

Ms Joyce thanked the judges – artist and educator Denise Ferris and Bega Valley Regional Gallery Director Iain Dawson.

"We spent quite a while considering the final 22 entries from a very robust field; it
