Narooma School of Arts has lodged a request for additional funding from the Bushfire Local Economic Recovery Fund at the invitation of the NSW Government. This was because of the extraordinary increases in construction costs over the last year. We're now waiting to hear if that was successful.

If successful, the anticipation is that NSoA would then enter into a Construction Contract with the builder early in 2023 to enable completion of the project by mid 2024.


Many of our regular groups are now operating as SOA 'outposts'.
